Orange High School is a comprehensive 9-12 school, offering a full complement of academic, co-curricular, and extra-curricular opportunities. The curricular includes college preparatory, college/technical preparatory, career/technical education, visual and performing arts, and technical opportunities such as A+ Programming and Linux + Certification. Students may also enroll in courses via the Virtual High School network or through the UNCG's iSchool program. Orange High school maintains a dual-enrollment relationship with area 2-year and 4-year colleges and the school also actively collaborates with various community agencies and organizations. Orange High operates a four-period day on a block schedule.

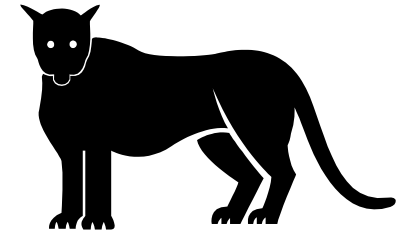
